OPEN GARDENS

The first Open Gardens took place on 16th July 1978. It was the idea of Fred Hammond, a founding member of the Committee and lifelong resident of Nayland, to ask the owners of some of our lovely gardens if they would allow the public in for one afternoon to raise funds for the society. Eleven gardens were open that first year, the tickets costing just 50p. The event proved to be such a success that the Committee were inspired to repeat the event. It has continued every year since apart from two years during the Covid pandemic when the gardens were available to see online and also in 2023 when there was an insufficient number of gardens offered. In the society's 50th Anniversary year it is hoped the event will be a special occasion.

The eleventh garden open was Parkers in Bear Street where Mr & Mrs Milne-Redhead lived. As well as opening their garden for the next seven years they also kindly offered the use of their barn for the teas.

As the years go by the number of visitors and profits have increased. People come from far and wide, many returning year after year. Donations from the proceeds have been made to various conservation bodies and projects. In 2000 to celebrate the Millennium a record number of 30 gardens were open over two days and about £2,000 was raised.

The Society is very grateful to Jean Dryden for the many years she designed and drew by hand the delightful posters for the Open Gardens event. Jean is a founder member and also produced the posters for our meetings for many years.

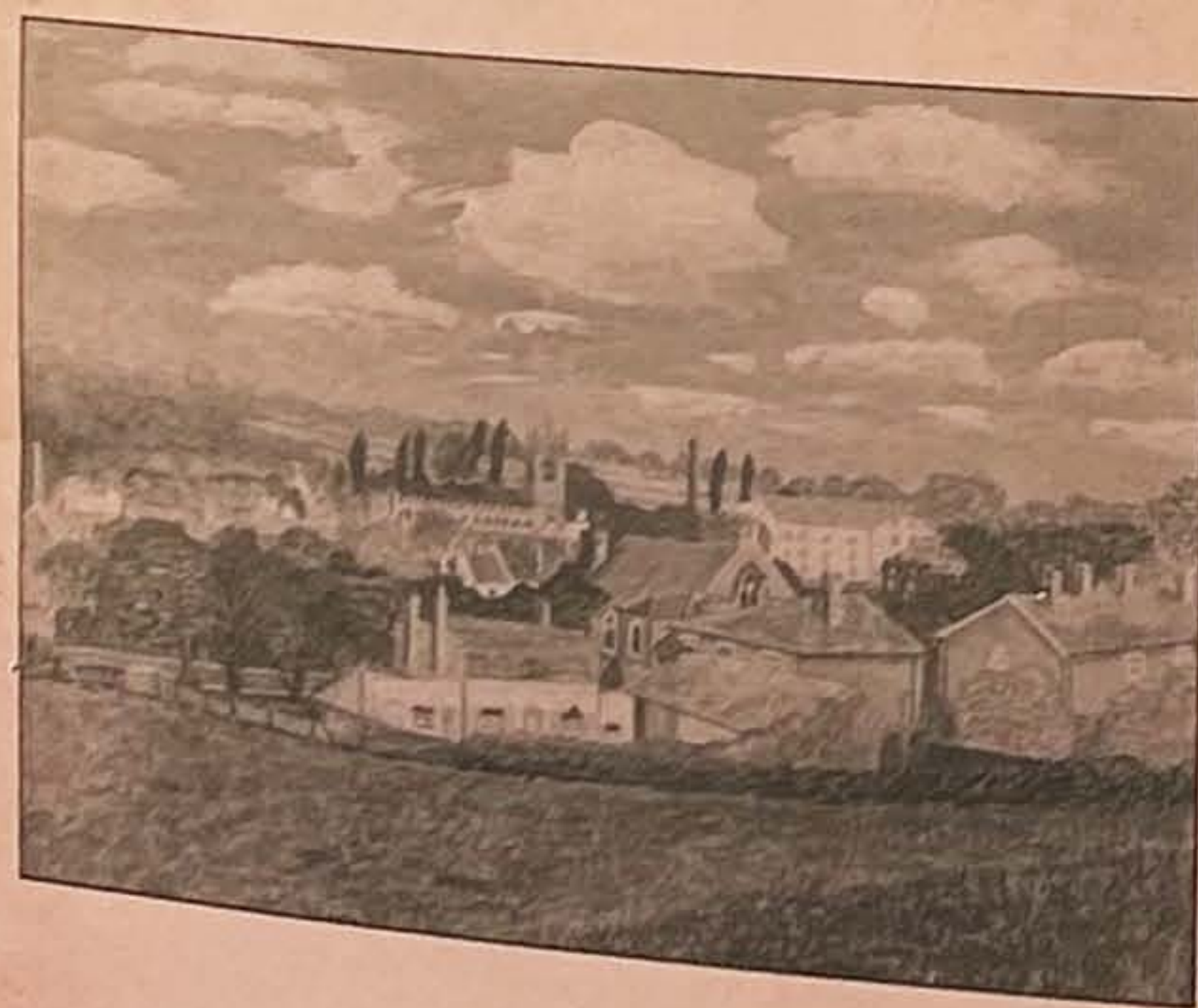
